

JDAIM LESSON PLANS 2021: TIPS FOR ONLINE SUCCESS

Note: These tips serve as a complement to Matan's JDAIM Lesson Plans, which are available for free download. During the 2020-2021 school year, when many schools have gone to virtual learning, we hope this will help you successfully implement JDAIM lesson plans, and provide you with ideas for your own virtual lessons, as well!

Kindergarten- 2nd grade:

- Use the electronic version of "We're Amazing, 1, 2, 3" and share the screen so the students can follow along.
 - o Note: Using Zoom? When you share your screen, be sure to click the boxes to "share computer sound" and "optimize screen share for video clip".
- Display the handout with the 3 Sesame Street characters in 3 columns by sharing your screen. Use the "annotate" feature on Zoom to fill it in together with your students
 - Note: if you are using a device that does not allow annotations, create a <u>Jamboard</u> instead. Students can type in their answers, draw them with the pen feature or upload images.
- Paired work: Assign students to breakout rooms instead.
 - o Note: As an alternative to breakout rooms, this activity can be done as a whole group. Collaborate using <u>Google Slides</u> or <u>Google Jamboard</u>.
- Asynchronous suggestion: Send a list of necessary art supplies to parents before the lesson.
 Students can use clay, playdough, markers or crayons at their own desks while their devices are on. Teachers can ask students to hold up their work to the screen to show what they are doing.
- Note: Alternatively, students can take a picture of their artwork and send it to the teacher.

3rd-5th grade:

- All handouts can be shared through a zoom screen share. Students can use the "annotate" feature to circle "the things you can do without talking."
 - o Note: If annotation is not an option on a student's device, the electronic handout can be uploaded into a Jamboard, where students will be able to circle their answers.
 - o Drawing can be done using the marker or pen tool on Jamboard

Middle-High School Students

- Stations: this is a great opportunity to use breakout rooms on Zoom. Students can rotate through the breakout rooms just like they would rotate through stations.
- Art station: students can use sites like Jamboard or Canva to decorate their verses and quotes
 - Note: Alternatively, this station can be done as an asynchronous assignment. Students
 can be told ahead of time what art supplies are needed and they can do this on their
 own at home
- Jamboard can be used as an alternative to butcher paper.
